#### **OLD BUSINESS**

## **Ingress/Egress Easement for Sanitary Sewer Trunk Main**

PWA Nohl is to meet with Andrew Hoerr next week regarding proposal the Village gave him in March. One of the stipulations he made the last time we talked was that Hoerr Construction would do the work but the Village needs to discuss legality of this with Village Attorney. Some towns give local contractors a discount percentage.

Engineer Yockey said we need to at least get a proposal from Hoerr's for cost. Also need to get design done. Engineer discussed design and said to put Design of Phase I of Trunk Sewer Easements on the next agenda. Engineer Yockey spoke about the design and how it would need to be upgraded. Engineer Yockey said a ball park estimate for the work would be \$240,000, cost for design, bid documents and EPA permits would be about \$40,000.

#### Raymond & Cleveland Street Right of Way

Nothing discussed.

#### Sewer Main Easement - Dr. Merheb & Barn III

There is a question of whether the Village has the original plat. We are not able to locate it. Engineer Yockey is going to check his files. Could also be under Lebo easements.

## Consideration of Right of Way and Dedicated Easement Plat of Martin Drive

Land surveyor is working to get documents drafted, will get them to the Village soon.

## Discussion on proposed revisions to Chapter 6, 7, 8, 10, 11 & 12

PWA Nohl has worked on revisions to Chapter 10. President Edwards gave Trustee Melton a copy of Chapter 7, which deals with Comprehensive Plan. President Edwards appointed Hank Melton Chairman of Village Code Review Committee.

#### **Comprehensive Plan**

PWA Nohl said ARPA Funds have been budgeted to go toward the Comprehensive Plan.

#### **Status of TIF Recoupment**

President Edwards, Attorney Gifford and Treasurer DeGrave met and discussed the TIF recoupment. TIF ended on 12-31-21. A letter was sent to the taxing bodies (except Fire Department). There has been no response from the School District Attorney. Treasurer DeGrave explained how they came to the figures.

## **Sewer Treatment Plant response letter to IEPA**

The Village has taken weekly samples and had a sludge study completed. We believe the reason there is too much TSS is because of sludge. Working with a company that does sludging and uses geo tubes. Sludge has increased a lot over the last 5 years. Getting prices from contractor. Will do the work in stages so it will be easier to budget costs. If coagulant is added it doesn't take too long for geo tubes to dry up. Village needs to send letter to EPA toward the end of the year. PWA Nohl has sent Engineer the timeline. The Village has also shut off or moved around aerator to see if this would help.

## Water Treatment Plant PLC Replacement

Looking to upgrade main PLC to have remote access. PLC we have now is outdated. Adding a couple high definition cameras. Last week line blew, not sure how long it was running. Zeller will give the Village a budget price. The Village wants to do time and material with a not to exceed price.

<u>Approval of Ordinance Granting a Special Use - Legacy Apartments – Ord. # 22-03</u> Motion was made by Nohl, seconded by Melton to approve the **Ordinance #22-03** granting a Special Use to Legacy Apartments. Engineer Yockey stated he does not feel the Village should approve the ordinance at this time. Some legal descriptions are not correct because preliminary plat has been changed. It needs to be updated with tress – how many rows, legal description – one lot was changed from Industrial to Business. Tabled until next month.
